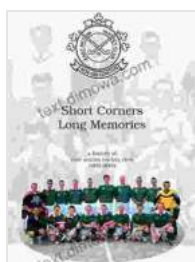

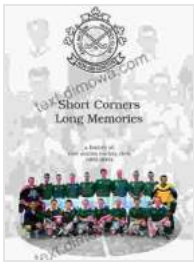

The club also represented Ulster in the All Ireland Senior Cup competition, reaching the final in 1953, 1955, 1958, and 1961. In 1958, the club finally won the All Ireland Senior Cup again, defeating Three Rock Rovers in the final.

The modern era has been a time of continued success for East Antrim Hockey Club. The club has won the Ulster Senior League title again in 1971, 198

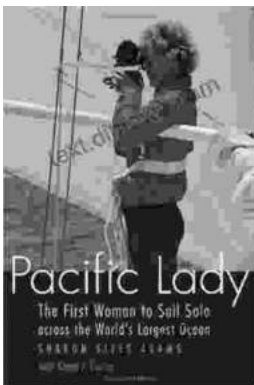

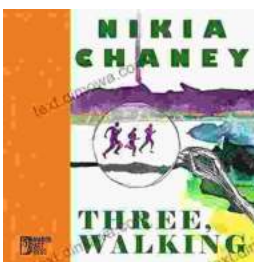
