Hughes' death was a shock to the world of cricket. He was a popular and respected player, and his loss was deeply felt by his family, friends, and fans.

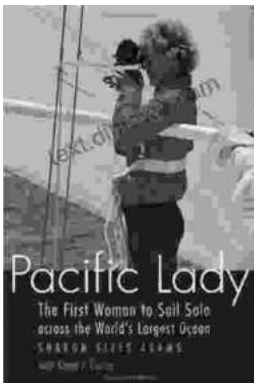

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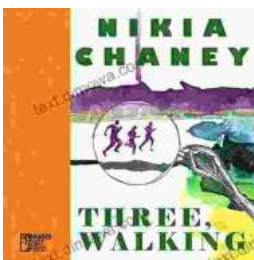
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
